Prevalence of type-II diabetes mellitus in Sirte, Libya

This study based on diabetic patients followed up regularly in diabetic care centre, Sirte. Libya. Total population of Sirte was 193,720: Out of which 12,867 (6.64%) were diabetic. Among them 3,849 (4.43%) were males and 9,018 (10.14%) were females. The mean age was 35.4 ranged. Among the total population 9,181 (71.4%) were Type-II diabetics, out of which obese sub type was 83.28%. If the patients, as well as the health care system do not take this disease seriously, devastating complications, sequel would result in significant morbidity, mortality and would impose a great financial burden on the health care system. Hence it is mandatory to find the means and methods to curb them.
