## Editorial Note for Journal of Bone Research

I am pleased to mention that during the year 2019, all issues of volume 7 of the **Journal of Bone Research** were published online well within the time that is in June and December respectively. The print issues were also brought out and dispatched within 30 days of publishing the issue online.

The journal has an impact factor of 1.81\* and an ICV value of 61.85. All the articles published in the last volume were of great scientific significance, they were also a remarkable contribution to the field of orthopedics and bone research covering all the related topics like Bone and Calcified Tissue, Bone Joint Surgery, Transplantation, Clinical Orthopedics, and Related Research, Bone & Joint Research. Arthritis, Arthroplasty, Fibromyalgia, Joint Replacement, Juvenile Rheumatoid Arthritis, Knee Osteoarthritis, Knee Replacement, Osteoarthritis diet, Osteoarthritis Etiology, Joint Disorder, Total Hip Replacement, Neurobiology, Pain, etc. and not only research articles but also high-quality Commentaries, Reviews, and Perspectives encapsulating the latest breakthroughs and developments.

I would like to bring to your kind notice the main highlight, Indexing and archiving cites of the journal which are Index Copernicus, Google Scholar, RefSeek, Publons (Clarivate), OCLC- WorldCat, Academic Keys, Sherpa Romeo, Open J Gate, Hamdard University and EBSCO A-Z. It was observed that many of the previously published articles were cited multiple times and citation reports were prepared.

The journal during this year received numerous papers from all around the globe, out of which many articles were rejected at the preliminary screening due to plagiarism or being out of the format. During 2019 over 10 articles were subjected to the peer-review process and 6 of those were accepted for publication by the reviewers. In the 2 issues of Volume 7 published 80% of articles were by authors from high-income countries but there were also many receiving's from low and middle-income countries (like African and Gulf countries) helping the emerging researches to portray their recent research observations.

The average publication time of an article was further reduced to 3-4 weeks as a rapid review and publication process was followed. It has provided a rapid turn-around time possible for reviewing and publishing and to disseminate the articles freely for research, teaching and reference purposes that all became possible with the support of our eminent reviewers from all around the world, especially from the USA and India.

I also take this opportunity to acknowledge the contribution of the Editorial team during the final editing of articles published and the support rendered by the editorial assistant, in bringing out issues of journal of Bone Research in time. I would also like to express my gratitude to all the authors, reviewers, the publisher, the advisory and the editorial board of Journal of Bone Research, the office bearers, and all the supporting staff members for their support in bringing out yet another volume of Journal of Bone Research and look forward to their unrelenting support to bring out the Volume 8 of the journal in scheduled time..
