

Insulinoma Patient with Acanthosis Nigricans

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DESCRIPTION




Figure 1: Patient with Acanthosis Nigricans.

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

A 46-year-old female patient analyzed to have insulinoma with hyperinsulinemia had acanthosis nigricans of grade 2 in the neck (Figure 1).
